## Indonesia



- The name *Indonesia* derives from Greek, Indos (Ἰνδός) and the word *nesos* (νῆσος), meaning "Indian islands". The name dates to the 18th century, far predating the formation of independent Indonesia.
- Located in Southeast Asia and Oceania, between the Indian and Pacific oceans.
- Indonesia consists of more than seventeen thousand islands
- The country's capital, Jakarta, is the second-most populous urban area in the world
- With over 267 million people, it is the world's 4th most populous country as well as the most populous Muslim-majority country.
- The country of Indonesia is ethnically diverse, with around 300 distinctive native ethnic groups and over 740 different languages and dialects spoken in the country.
- The currency in Indonesia is called the Rupiah.

## Indonesia



- The geography of Indonesia is dominated by volcanoes that are formed due to subduction zones between the Eurasian plate and the Indo-Australian plate.
- Indonesia is located in the Pacific Ring of Fire, otherwise known as the most active seismic region on the planet.
- There are more than 877 mountains in Indonesia and East Timor. Some of them are active and others inactive or dormant.
- Some of the volcanoes are notable for their eruptions, for instance, Krakatoa for its global effects in 1883, the Lake Toba Caldera for its supervolcanic eruption estimated to have occurred 74,000 years before present which was responsible for six years of volcanic winter, and Mount Tambora for the most violent eruption in recorded history in 1815.

## Colonial era

- The first Europeans arrived in the archipelago in 1512, when Portuguese traders, led by Francisco Serrão, sought to monopolise the sources of nutmeg, cloves, and cubeb pepper in the Maluku Islands
- Dutch and British traders followed. In 1602, the Dutch established the Dutch East India Company (VOC) and became the dominant European power for almost 200 years.
- The VOC was dissolved in 1800 following bankruptcy, and the Netherlands established the Dutch East Indies as a nationalised colony
- The Japanese invasion and subsequent occupation in 1942–45 during WWII ended Dutch rule, and encouraged the previously suppressed Indonesian independence movement.

## Sukarno

- **Sukarno, born Kusno Sosrodihardjo, 6th June 1901 – 21 June 1970**
- **He was an Indonesian politician who was the first president of Indonesia, serving from 1945 to 1967**
- **He was a prominent leader of Indonesia's nationalist movement during the Dutch colonial period and spent over a decade under Dutch detention.**
- **He was replaced in 1967 by one of his generals, Suharto, and remained under house arrest until his death in 1970.**

## Mohammad Hatta

- **After his early education, he studied in Dutch schools in the Dutch East Indies and studied in the Netherlands from 1921 until 1932**
- **Hatta is often remembered as Bung Hatta (according to author Pramoedya Ananta Toer, "bung" is an affectionate title meaning "friend")**

## Micro-organisms



- Micro-organisms (also known as **microbes**) cannot be seen by the naked eye (micro means tiny and organism means a living creature); many hundreds of them would fit on the full stop at the end of this sentence.
- **They are found everywhere**, in soil, air, water, on your skin and in your guts. Most of the time, when they are in the right place the majority of micro-organisms are **not harmful to people** and often do a lot of good such as breaking down waste and making bread.
- **There is a huge variety of micro-organisms.** They can work alone or in colonies. They can help you or hurt you. Most importantly, they make up the **largest number of living organisms** on the planet.

## Micro-organisms

The **five types of living micro-organisms** are bacteria, viruses, fungi, algae and protozoa.

- **Bacteria** can be rod-shaped, spiral-shaped or spherical. Some bacteria can be useful, such as certain types found in the stomach, but other nasty kinds can give you a bad tummy ache or a sore throat.
- **Viruses** are parasites, which means they can only survive inside the cells of other living things. They can cause infectious diseases, such as chicken pox or measles.
- **Fungi** can be different sizes ranging from a single cell, like yeast (used to make bread rise), or other fungi such as moulds or toadstools.
- **Algae** can also be many different sizes – some single-celled algae are actually used in toothpaste!
- **Protozoa** are single-celled organisms and can cause many diseases, although they are occasionally helpful too.
