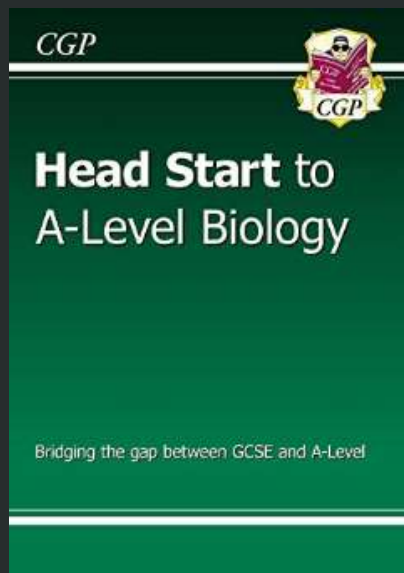


Head start A-Level Biology
