### **Task 2**

Mr Giles decided to award 3 points for each Gold Medal, 2 points for each Silver Medal and 1 point for each Bronze Medal.

Using this new system can you write out the new list of the Top 15 countries?

### **Extension Task**

Mr Giles has a strange idea. He notices that 31 countries won no Gold medals. He wants to write a Top Ten for these countries and uses the following method:

- For each Silver Medal they get the same number of points as there are letters in the country's name
  - For each Bronze Medal they get the same number of points as half the number of letters in the country's name
- So, for example, F-I-N-L-A-N-D would get 7 points for a Silver Medal and 7 points for a Bronze Medal

Use this to find out the Top Ten countries who did not win a Gold Medal.
